solution to the problem but still a war with people getting maimed and killed in world war one germany was the problem once again lust for power i wasn't even thought of at that period of time in fact i hadn't even arrived on the scene at that point of time but think about it for a moment there's not one inch of land that has increased in size in those thousands of years of civilization and wars i was a training in camp blanding in florida we could look in any direction and there was a sign posted in large letters kill or be killed kill or be killed we were just 18 or 19 year old kids think about it kill or be killed what an education but necessary to imprint it inside our young brains it gave us young kids a reason to become killers hesitate for a second and you're dead back then in training we used to repeat over and over was that wars were necessary to decrease the surplus population it is most certainly a true statement
